





Karen Gibbons-Brown

Karen Gibbons-Brown's resume contains an impressive list of credentials. She began her early training in Columbia, South Carolina under Ann Brodie, Naomi Calvert and Adolphina Suarez-More. Her early training and performing included ballet as well as modern, jazz, tap and theater dance. She continued her studies at American Ballet Theatre with Maria Swoboda, Michael Lland, Patricia Wilde and Leon Danelian and studied on scholarship at David Howard School of Ballet.

Her professional experiences also include South Carolina Chamber Dance Ensemble, Ballet Celeste, Bristol Ballet and the Theatre Ballet of San Francisco where she recreated Anna Pavlova's roles The California Poppy and The Dragonfly. Other performing highlights include performances at the Spoleto Festival in Charleston, South Carolina, the title role in Cinderella, The Sugar Plum Fairy in The Nutcracker, Swanhilda in Coppelia, Aurora in The Sleeping Beauty and "Spring Waters" pas de deux, an exciting display of partnering created by the great Russian choreographer Asaf Messerer. Ms. Gibbons-Brown considers herself fortunate to have had works created especially for her including solos, Pentimento by Jill Eathorne Barr and the role of Anna in Richard Monroe's work, The Hussar. Throughout her career, she has made numerous guest appearances throughout the United States.

Ms. Gibbons-Brown is known for her work in the classroom and enjoys teaching a variety of dance related subjects including ballet, pointe, repertoire, terminology, dance history, pedagogue and makeup and hair for stage as well as restaging major classical works. She has often been invited to teach guest classes and workshops including in Sicily, Italy, Fontenay le Fleury, France and the prestigious Joffrey San Antonio Workshop under the directorship of her mentor Jeremy Blanton. She received her certification in Labanotation while serving on the faculty of Virginia Intermont College under the direction of Constance Hardinge and served as Ballet Mistress for John McFall as he created his production of The Nutcracker for Atlanta Ballet. In 1985, Ms. Gibbons-Brown founded the Kingsport Guild of Ballet and became Artistic Director of the State of Franklin Dance Alliance at its inception in 1988. Other dance administrative duties include serving on the Tennessee Association Board of Directors in many capacities including as president and serving on the Performing Arts Panel for the Tennessee Arts Commission. She assumed directorship of Fort Wayne Ballet in August of 1998. Other career highlights include Outstanding Dance Artist Award in 1997, serving as a juror for Concours International de Danse Classique in Paris, France in 2000, a 2002 graduate of Leadership Fort Wayne and being listed in Who's Who in the 21st Century. In 2010, a new book authored by renowned choreographer Dean Speer, entitled On Technique, identifies Ms. Gibbons-Brown as among the world's 18 most respected ballet masters, pedagogues and artistic directors. Karen is an ABT® Certified Teacher, who has successfully completed the American Ballet Theatre® Teacher Training Intensive in Pre-Primary through Level 9 of the ABT® National Training Curriculum, and is on the ABT's Board of Examiners. Her other full time job is spending time with her husband. Jim. and a sundry of dogs.

discovery. We look forward to seeing you!



Amber began dancing in Traverse City, Michigan and continued her training at the University of Oklahoma. She graduated in 2018 with a BFA in Dance and BA in Mathematics. Amber is entering her sixth season with Fort Wayne Ballet where she has had the opportunity to perform principal roles in Swan Lake (Odette/Odile), The Sleeping Beauty (Aurora), The Nutcracker (Sugar Plum Fairy), A Midsummer's Night's Dream (Helena), Dracula (Lucy) and The Phantom of the Opera (Christine). Amber has also been featured in works by Val Caniparoli, Gerald Arpino, Robert Joffrey and Edward Stierle. She's performed abroad in Taizhou, China with Fort Wayne Ballet and in Barcelona, Spain with Centre de Dansa de Catalunya. Her choreography has been performed at both the University of Oklahoma and Fort Wayne Ballet. She's a fully certified, ABT® Affiliate Instructor and enjoys sharing her passion with growing artists. Amber looks forward to another season with Fort Wayne Ballet.



Raised in Dayton, Ohio, Avalou trained in a pre-professional company, Gem City Ballet. In December 2019, Avalou graduated with her BFA summa cum laude, majoring in Ballet, from the University of Cincinnati's College-Conservatory of Music, under Qi Jiang and Deirdre Carberry. Avalou performed lead roles in Petipa's Paquita (Paquita) and in La Bayadere (Shade #2). During her sophomore year at CCM, Avalou was accepted into BalletMet's trainee program, with Edwaard Liang and Maria Torija. As a trainee, Avalou danced in Balanchine's Serenade, Liang's Don Quixote, and performed in numerous outreaches with BalletMet's Second Company. In 2020, she joined Fort Wayne Ballet and has enjoyed dancing in Gerald Arpino's Light Rain and Italian Suite, Edward Stierle's Concerto Con Brio, Agnes de Mille's Three Virgins and a Devil, and Petipa's Sleeping Beauty as the Diamond Fairy and Little Red. Avalou also teaches in the academy as an ABT® Certified Teacher and Youth Company Assistant.



Originally from Cancun, Mexico. Alan began his training at Escuela de Danza Talulah and attended summer programs and workshops such as Point Park University's International Summer Dance, Monterrey International Ballet Gala and Workshop and competed at Concurso Internacional de Ballet La Superior and Youth America Grand Prix. He graduated from Escuela Superior de Música y Danza de Monterrey (ESMDM) with a Balechelor of Fine Arts in Classical Dance. After graduating he joined Fort Wayne Ballet as a company member where he has had the honor to perform in a variety of works including Gerald Arpino's "Light Rain" and "Italian Suit", Val Caniparoli's "Swipe", Agnes de Mille's "Three Virgins and a Devil", "Lacrymosa" and "Empyrean Dances" by Edward Stierle and Romeo in "Romeo and Juliet". Alan is thrilled to be back for his fourth season with the Fort Wayne Ballet.



Chloe grew up in Prince Edward Island, Canada, training at Island Dance Academy and the Maritime Conservatory of Performing Arts. She received further training at the National Ballet School of Canada, The Royal Winnipeg Ballet School, Victoria Academy of Ballet, and Orlando Ballet, before attending the Alberta Ballet's Post-Graduate Program, during which time she also performed with Canada's Ballet Jörgen's Junior Company. Since graduating, Max has worked as a company and guest artist with companies and schools around the country including Orlando Ballet, Grand Kyiv Ballet (Ukraine), United Ballet Theatre, Indianapolis Ballet, Colorado Ballet Society, and Troy University department of Theater and Dance. Max has also had the honor of being invited to dance in several galas alongside artists from internationally acclaimed companies including New York City Ballet, Houston Ballet, Miami City Ballet, Estonian National Ballet, and more. In January of 2024, Max was awarded platinum for his 1st place performance of Diana and Acteon Pas de Deux at Universal Ballet Competition in Denver, Colorado.



Izumi was born in Yamanashi, Japan, and started ballet at Miwa's Ballet school. She later studied on full scholarship at ABS (Austrian Ballet School). Izumi received First Place Award at the 41st Saitama Prefecture Dance Association National Contest in 2008. Concurrent with her graduation from the Austrian Ballet School, Izumi was promoted to ABC Tokyo Ballet Company as a Soloist Dancer in 2013. Izumi also danced with Arts Ballet Theatre of Florida before joining Fort Wayne Ballet. Since joining Fort Wayne Ballet, Izumi's danced featured roles including Ruth Ricordi per Due, Light Rain by Gerald Arpino, Lacrymosa by Edward Stierle. THE STORY OF THE NUTCRACKER

As the curtain opens, relatives and guests make their way through the wintery evening toward the Von Stahlbaum mansion.

The most special guest is Herr Drosselmeyer, Clara's godfather. He is a toymaker who creates magical toys that come to life. When Herr Drosselmeyer arrives at the party with his nephew, Christian Drosselmeyer, the guests are delighted with the surprises and gifts he has brought. Amidst the excitement of the party, Herr Drosselmeyer presents a special gift to Clara: a nutcracker. Fritz and his friends tease Clara and the other girls, and in the process, Fritz seizes the toy from Clara and breaks it. Clara is in tears as Herr Drosselmeyer mends the nutcracker, then gently puts him back in Clara's arms. Clara and Fritz are taken to bed as the guests leave.

Later that evening, long after the party is over, Clara quietly tiptoes back to the parlor to find her beloved nutcracker. Cradling it in her arms, she falls asleep and begins to dream that frightening mice have come to steal the Christmas presents. As the clock strikes midnight, giant mice appear and snatch the nutcracker from Clara's arms. Herr Drosselmeyer intervenes and the magical journey begins. 

Guest Conductor

JAMES SOMMERVILLE

Conductor James Sommerville's celebrated career has seen him on the podium of many of the finest professional orchestras and ensembles throughout Canada and the USA. He led the Hamilton Philharmonic Orchestra to great critical acclaim in his seven seasons as Music Director. Recent engagements include appearances with Symphony Nova Scotia and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, as well as the Edmonton, London (Ontario) and Québec Symphony Orchestras. Internationally, Mr Sommerville has been conductor of the US National Brass Ensemble in concert and on their award-winning CD of music of Gabrieli and Williams, as well as a variety of ensembles throughout the USA, Europe and Asia. He has commissioned solo and chamber works from many young Canadian and international composers, including Kati Agócs, Vivian Fung, Nicole Lizée, Kelly-Marie Murphy, Abigail Richardson-Schulte, Jocelyn Morlock, Roger Bergs, and many more.

James Sommerville retired as Principal Horn of the Boston Symphony Orchestra in December of 2022, after a glittering 25 year tenure, capping an orchestral career that included seasons with the Toronto and Montreal Symphony Orchestras, the Canadian Opera Company Orchestra, Symphony Nova Scotia, and as acting solo horn of the Chamber Orchestra of Europe. The winner of the highest prizes at the Munich, Toulon and CBC solo competitions, Mr. Sommerville also pursued a career as a French Horn soloist that spanned over 35 years, and has brought immensely successful appearances with major orchestras throughout North America and Europe. His disc of the Mozart Horn Concertos with the CBC Vancouver Orchestra won the JUNO Award for Best Classical Recording in Canada. Other award-winning CBC recordings include the Britten Serenade for Tenor, Horn, and Strings, and Britten's Canticle. Mr. Sommerville has recorded chamber music for the Deutsche Gramophon, Telarc, CBC, Summit, and Marquis labels. He toured and recorded regularly as a member of the Boston Symphony Chamber Players. He is heard regularly on the CBC network and has recorded all of the standard solo horn repertoire for broadcast.

As a guest artist and faculty member, Mr. Sommerville has performed at many chamber music festivals throughout Canada, the USA, Europe, Oceania and Asia. Solo performances of note include the world premiere of Christos Hatzis' Winter Solstice in Yellowknife, NWT; the North American premiere of Ligeti's Hamburg Concerto with the BSO; and the John Williams Horn Concerto. In 2007, he performed the world premiere of Elliot Carter's Horn Concerto, commissioned for him by the Boston Symphony Orchestra. In recent seasons, Mr. Sommerville has appeared as a soloist in London (with the Academy of St. Martin-in-the-Fields), and in Costa Rica, Holland, Quebec, Ottawa and Italy.


